Who are we?

- In 2016, Ed Jordan started a volunteer grassroots organization called Carter County Proud. By 2018, the group became an affiliate of Keep America Beautiful and Keep Tennessee Beautiful and was renamed as Keep Carter County Beautiful (KCCB).
- In 2022, the group became a Tennessee Non-Profit Corporation and a Federal Public Charity 501(c)3.
- KCCB is an all-volunteer organization; all funding goes directly back into the community.
- We are governed by a Board of Directors who meet monthly. All meetings are open to the public.

Litter Clean-Up

- KCCB participates in TDOT's Adopt-A-Highway program along Milligan Highway between W. Elk Avenue and Okolona Road.
- KCCB partners with *Keep the Tennessee River Beautiful* to cleanup Watauga Lake.
- KCCB sponsors highway and waterway cleanups throughout Carter County.
- KCCB has partnered with Carter County Landfill & TDOT to provide tarps for preventing littering by uncovered loads.



Beautification

- Each year, KCCB plants new trees along the Tweetsie and Linear Trails and in other public spaces within the county. Many are flowering trees that provide shade and habitats for wildlife.
- Each May, numerous wildflower plots are planted in county parks and along our trails, to create roadway and park beautification.
- We also are giving away seed packets at our information booths. This encourages residents to create gardens that promote beauty, supports pollinators, and migrating birds.





Recycling Awareness

- If you attend the summer activities at the Covered Bridge Park, you'll see our KCCB recycle bins for cans & plastic bottles. We collect the recyclables and take them to a Carter County Recycle Center.
- We provide recycling education and information on our website and at numerous information booths at county events.
- We provide recycle bins to businesses like the Bonnie Kate Theater, Yoga Farm, and Chamber of Commerce.
- We provide recycle bins and recycle collection at special events throughout the county.





Educational Awareness

- KCCB sponsors information booths at numerous events throughout the year.
- We provide educational material like activity books for children, litter law booklets, stickers, calendars, yard signs, seeds, etc.
- Our website offers educational videos and presentations.
- We provide residents with information on litter and dumping enforcement and reporting.
- We provide presentations to schools and community organizations.
- We gain national recognition for Carter County by providing TDOT and *Keep America Beautiful* with critical data on our efforts and successes.





Tourism and Recreation

- KCCB coordinated a county grant to design, create and deliver wayfinding signs.
- Signs highlight biking, camping, paddling, picnic areas, boat launch, and horseback riding areas.
- The Roan Mountain community, KCCB, and Americorps volunteers installed wayfinding signs at several sites in Roan Mountain.
- KCCB, Southern Off-Road Bicycle Association, and Elizabethton Parks and Recreation installed wayfinding signs at Hampton Green Bridge Landing and Watershed Bike Trails.
- Wayfinding sign installation will continue through 2023.





Source of Funding

Section 39-14-510 of TCA 39-14-5 states:

All proceeds from the fines imposed by this code shall be deposited in the general fund of the county where the offense occurred and designated for county operating costs with preference given to litter prevention programs and education such as those conducted by Keep America Beautiful. The mayor of each county shall be the administrative official for these funds and shall ensure that the program is administered appropriately. The mayor is also empowered to authorize disbursements from the county's general fund from the proceeds collected for litter enforcement, prevention, control and education.

The county mayor shall be further empowered to enter into agreements with city mayors or city managers within the mayor's county as to disbursements of moneys for violations of litter control and prevention laws that occur within municipal boundaries. Recycling

KCCB Program Expansion:

- Expand our work with businesses, community organizations and citizens.
- Expand our support and promotion of programs like TDOT's Adopt-A-Highway and start new programs like Adopt-A-Spot.
- Expand our outreach and identify problem areas for coordinating community cleanup events.
- Expand our recycling and composting program and get the community more involved.
- Grow our volunteer base and encourage participation and pride in our community.
- Encourage local restaurants, retail stores, and grocers to reduce plastic waste by switching to compostable packaging and utensils.
- Encourage local businesses and residents to take care of their property and the public areas around them.
- Work with law enforcement in identifying offenders and support their prosecution.
- Educate and keep the public informed on Tennessee Code changes.
- Expand the cleanup of our waterways with Trout Trash Traps and Seabins.
- Expand our beautification programs to include more wildflower plots, trees and tree maintenance.
- Expand the covered load Tarp Give-A-Way Program at the County Landfill.
- Install more Wayfinding signs and promote tourism.
- Expand our recycling bin program to include permanent recycle bins at additional county and state parks
- Expand our School Education program to involve more students
